Exploring Ohio's Indigenous Cultures

Description

In this inquiry-based program, students will use real museum artifacts and replicas to tell the stories of the four main eras of indigenous people who populated Ohio before the arrival of European Settlers in 1650. This hands on, group based program will allow 3rd-5th graders to gain important insight on the earliest peoples who populated our state.

Objectives

- Students will compare artifacts from different eras to learn about the people who created them
- Students will work in a group setting to answer questions and solve problems
- Students will gain familiarity with the different groups of people who once lived in Ohio
- Students will draw conclusions about the lifestyles of indigenous peoples

Vocabulary

Diagnostic artifact: An item that is indicative of a particular time or cultural group

Indigenous People: Distinct social and cultural groups that share collective ancestral ties to the lands and natural resources where they live

Mastodon: A large extinct elephant-like mammal of the Miocene to Pleistocene epochs

Pre-contact: The time period before contact was established with indigenous people

Ohio Native Americans: Your students will enjoy exploring the culture, myths, clothing and artifacts of Ohio Native Americans. This kit is full of fascinating artifacts from the Ohio Native Americans, including woven baskets, a birchbark canoe, sweetgrass braid, cornhusk doll. A pair of mocassins is included, along with a hole punch and plastic lacing in case your students want to tackle mocassin creation. Pieces of flint and an arrowhead round out the kit, along with an assortment of books, a Teacher's Guide and an activity guide. Materials aligned for students in grade 5
